Sof davar...

Tannaim and Amoraim: R. Yehoshua ben Levi (Riva"l)

This first generation *amora* from Eretz Yisroel was the student of bar Kappara who also happened to be his uncle. Together with R. Chanina he went to the local governor on some matter concerning the Jews. When he entered the governor's office the governor stood up for him. The governor's flunkies asked him why he stood for a Jew of all people. He responded by saying that R. Yehoshua's face was like that of an angel. Subsequently Riva''l went on a mission to Rome. Upon his return to Acco R. Chanina noticed that he was limping. He compared him to Yaakov Avinu who limped after his encounter with Eisav's officer. It was said of Riva''l, a master in the field of *agada*, that he would engage in conversations with Eliyahu haNavi. Once Rival asked Eliyahu when the *moshiach* would come. He told him to go ask him yourself. Riva''l, surprised, asked where he is. He is in Rome, Eliyahu responded, among the poor taking care of their medical needs. Rival traveled to Rome and found him and after exchanging greetings asked him when he would come. Today, he said. Riva''l returned home, met Eliyahu haNavi, and told him that the *moshiach* made fun of him saying he would come today. Eliyahu answered by saying that he was not making fun of him. He would come today if all the people would listen to the words of the Torah. (Consider his response today.) Every Friday afternoon one of his grandsons would read from the *parsha* to him. One time he forgot about it and did not remind himself till he was in the bathhouse. He quickly dressed and ran home to hear his grandson. It was his practice to fast on the *tenth* day of Av because, he said, most of the destruction of the *bet hamikdash* took place on that day, not on the ninth. R. Yehoshua ben Levi is the author of many familiar statements. Among them he composed the *kre-at shema* prayers said before retiring. It was he who urged everyone to be among the first ten to arrive in shul for *davening*, (OT members listen!) and it was one of his *maamarim* that was chosen to be said at
