Samuel Myer Isaacs (1804-1878)

Last week, I stated that until the arrival of Rabbi Abraham Rice in the 1840s, there were only preachers and chazanim in America. Among the most notable of these Orthodox ministers was Samuel Myer Isaacs. Born in Holland, and educated in London, Isaacs came to New York at the invitation of Congregation B'nai Jeshurun, in 1839. B'nai Jeshurun had been formed in 1825 as New York's first Ashkenaz shul, a breakaway from, what was then the only synagogue in New York, the Sephardic Shearith Israel, Spanish and Portuguese congregation. B'nai Jeshurun had a building on Elm Street in Lower Manhattan, and Samuel Isaacs was invited to serve as their first religious leader. But unlike Europe, where for centuries Jewish life was controlled by one kehilla council, no central entity administered New York Jewish life. As such, America became the land of breakaway synagogues. And so it was at B'nai Jeshurun, itself a breakaway shul, where a group of mostly Anglo-Jewish immigrants, left in 1845 to form New York's second Ashkenaz congregation, Shaaray Tefilla. Isaacs agreed to become their religious leader, a position he held for more than three decades.

While Isaacs did not have semicha, he proved to be a capable preacher, teacher, chazzan and communal leader. He was one of the founders of Jews' Hospital (1852), later renamed Mt. Sinai Hospital, and assisted in the formation of the Hebrew Orphan Asylum, the Jewish Home for the Aged and United Hebrew Charities. During that same decade (1850s), when Reform congregations were emerging, Isaacs became a vocal opponent of religious change, establishing and editing a newspaper, *The Jewish Messenger* (1857), to promote the interests of Orthodox Judaism. Samuel Isaacs died in 1878 and is buried at the Cypress Hills Cemetery, New York.

One further note: both B'nai Jeshurun and Shaaray Tefila remain to this day. In 1865, B'nai Jeshurun moved to a new building on 34th Street and Seventh Ave. Yes folks! that familiar parcel of land later became the site of Macy's flagship store. For more than 100 years, B'nai Jeshurun was a Conservative synagogue until it left the movement in the 1990s to become independent. As for Shaaray Tefila, the congregation joined the Reform movement in 1902, 25 years after the death of Samuel Isaacs.
