Abraham Joseph Rice (1802-1862)

Until the mid 1800s, there were preachers and chazanim in America but no ordained rabbonim. This changed in 1840, when Rabbi Abraham Rice arrived in the United States. With several years of Torah learning in Furth, Germany and semicha from R. Abraham Bing of Wurzburg, Rice was unsuccessful in rejuvenating the historic Yeshuat Israel synagogue at Newport, Rhode Island, and moved to Baltimore to become Rabbi at Congregation Nidchei Israel (aka Baltimore Hebrew Congregation). Nidchei Israel, had been formed in 1829, and at the time, was the only shul in the State of Maryland. In 1845, a large and distinguished synagogue was built on Lloyd Street, and the shul, not surprisingly, became known as the Lloyd Street Synagogue. The synagogue basement housed a mikveh and an oven for baking matzah. The landmark building is the third oldest surviving synagogue in the United States, and following a major restoration in the 1960s, serves at present, as the home of the Jewish Museum of Maryland. As for Abraham Rice, he removed himself as rabbi of the shul in 1849 to pursue his livelihood as a merchant. But he formed a small congregation called Sherith Israel, where he served as rabbi without compensation, and continued to offer spiritual counsel and halachic guidance to Baltimore Jewry. Rice died in 1862 but his sermons and halachic pronouncements live on in the pages of The Occident, a monthly magazine which, at that time, promoted Jewish tradition in the face of a growing Reform Jewish movement.
