Sof Davar

Yissachar Dov Illowy (1814-1871)

Among the first talmidei chachamim to arrive in America in the mid 1800s was Yissachar Dov (Bernard) Illowy. His grandfather had been the Rav of Kolin, 35 miles east of Prague, where Illowy was born in 1814. He went to the famed yeshiva of Pressburg, (commonly known today as Bratislava, Slovakia) under the direction of the revered Rav and posek, R. Moshe Sofer, the Hatam Sofer. Following semicha, Illowy enrolled at the University of Budapest, where he completed graduate work in languages and classics.

When Illowy came to New York around 1852, he was the first ordained Orthodox rabbi in America to possess a Ph.D. degree. For almost twenty years, he served as congregational rabbi in several communities, including Philadelphia, St. Louis, New Orleans and Cincinnati.

The 1850s was a time when Reform Judaism was taking hold in America. Isaac Mayer Wise, Max Lilienthal and David Einhorn were among the leaders and spokesmen of Reform, inspiring synagogues across the country to change direction from Orthodoxy to Reform. Illowy emerged as an ardent defender of tradition, preaching, teaching and publishing articles in an attempt to preserve the traditional status quo.

In matters of halacha, Illowy was one of only a few learned individuals who could respond with competence and authority. From routine questions like the kashruth status of a Torah scroll in Cleveland to what type of image designs may or may not be used on tombstones, Illowy responded to halachic questions from people throughout the country. Some of his essays and legal discussions may be found in *The Occident* and the *Jewish Messenger*, newspapers that promoted Orthodox tradition, at that time. As well, a posthumous work titled *Sefer Milchamot Elohim: Letters and Casuistic Decisions of the late Rabbi Bernard Illowy* was published by his son in Berlin, 1914. It is a rare volume, which I happily have in my library.

Sadly, Illowy's life was brought to an untimely end, when he was killed in a horse-drawn carriage accident. He died on June 21, 1871 leaving a wife, three sons and a daughter and is buried at the cemetery grounds of Congregation Shearith Israel in Cincinnati.
