Abraham Joseph Ash (1815-1887)

While the large wave of Jewish immigrants from Eastern Europe did not begin until the 1880s, there were small numbers of East European Jews who came to America prior to and following the Civil War. Among them was Abraham Joseph Ash, who arrived in New York around 1851. Born in Siemiatycze, still today a small town of 15,000 people in north-eastern Poland, Ash came to New York when most congregants of Orthodox synagogues were from Western or Central Europe. Ash therefore founded a new shul in 1852 called the Beth Hamidrash, New York's first Russian-Polish congregation. He earned a meager livelihood in business, while serving at the Beth Hamidrash as an unsalaried religious leader. The congregation frequently moved from one storefront to another, but in 1856, with the assistance of wealthy Sephardic Jews, they purchased a Welsh chapel on 78 Allen Street. But there were constant quarrels within the shul leadership regarding power and authority, particularly between Ash, the unsalaried rabbi and the President of the shul. Following contested synagogue elections and members bitterly taking sides between the rabbi and the President, Rabbi Ash took the shul president to court to oust him from power. When the court rejected the rabbi's arguments, Ash left the Beth Hamidrash in 1859, and formed a new shul called Beth Hamedrash Hagodol. The shul president and followers remained at the Beth Hamidrash, which later formed the basis of Kahal Adath Jeshurun, more famously known today as the Eldridge Street Synagogue.

During the 1860s, Ash continued to lead the Beth Hamedrash Hagodol on a part time basis, earning his livelihood in business, first as a manufacturer of hoopskirts, and later as a wine merchant. The shul had some novel ways of raising funds. Mourners who came to recite *kaddish* could purchase sponge cake and a glass of brandy for ten cents. The shul congregants were not happy with Rabbi Ash's outside business ventures as well as his inclination towards hasidism. He resigned as rabbi in 1877. Two years later, the Beth Hamedrash Hagodol invited the great Rav talmud chacham, R. Meir Leibush ben Yechiel Michel Weiser, or the MALBIM, to become Chief Rabbi of New York. Sadly, the MALBIM died before leaving Europe for America. The Beth Hamedrash Hagodol promptly re-hired Rabbi Ash, and then hired a new chazan, who incidentally, they paid over three times the salary of Rabbi Ash. Ash died in New York City in 1887, survived by a wife and five children.
