Abraham Jacob Gershon Lesser (1834-1924)

One of the great rabbonim to arrive in America in the early 1880s was Abraham Jacob Gershon Lesser. Born in Mir, Belarus, he studied at the local Mir yeshiva before leaving for Minsk to continue learning with R. Gershom Tanchum, communal rabbi of Minsk. Lesser later received semicha from R.Yitzchak Elchanan Spektor and R. Yitzchak Charif of Slonim. He served as communal rav of several towns in Europe before immigrating to the United States in 1882. At the invitation of one of Chicago's leading synagogues, he became rabbi of Beth Hamedrash Hagadol-B'nai Jacob. Throughout the 1880s, thousands of Jewish immigrants were arriving in Chicago, and Lesser worked diligently to meet their many needs.

One notable event concerns his participation in William Blackstone's petition to the President for a Jewish homeland in Palestine. Blackstone was a Christian evangelist, who in his early career focused much attention on the <u>restoration of Jews to Palestine</u> as a prelude to their conversion to Christianity. It was seen as part of a Protestant desire to hasten the final coming of the Messiah. But Blackstone became genuinely concerned with Czarist inspired pogroms against Jews, and began to call on political leaders to create a Jewish homeland in Israel, in order to save Jewish lives. In 1891, Blackstone gathered hundreds of signatures from prominent individuals, including John D. Rockefeller, J.P. Morgan, senators, congressmen, religious leaders of all denominations, newspaper editors, and more, that called on the President to support a Jewish restoration to land of Israel. Please note that this petition predated, and in some ways presaged, the later ideas of Theodor Herzl in 1896. Apparently, Rabbi Avraham Lesser signed the petition, and remained in communication with William Blackstone. In 1897, with some measure of encouragement from Blackstone, Lesser published a lengthy treatise in Hebrew titled, *Be-Acharit Ha-Yamim*. Written in the style of a dialogue between a father and son, the theme of the work concerned matters of *kibbutz galuyot* and the return of Jews to Israel. The work was printed with an accompanying English translation, and last week, a first edition, Chicago 1897 copy of *Be-Acharit Ha-Yamim* was auctioned at Kestenbaum & Co., Auctioneers of Rare Books, Manuscripts and Fine Art.

Lesser's rabbinic talents were particularly well known in the Midwest, and in 1898, he accepted a prestigious position in Cincinnati as rabbi of a consortium of three shuls, of which the lead synagogue was Congregation Bet Tephila, known as Reb Shachna's shul, in memory of its former dynamic leader, R. Shachna Isaacs.

Cincinnati at the time was the center of Reform Judaism in America, where Isaac M. Wise continued to dominate the leadership of Reform. Lesser would spend the balance of his professional career, trying to maintain Orthodox tradition in a city where Reform Judaism was predominant. Rabbi Abraham Lesser also served as the lead mashgiach supervisor of Manischewicz machine made matzah, at the time located in Cincinnati. In a lengthy article published in Beit Va'ad La'hakhamim I (Shvat 1903), Lesser describes, what was until then, the most detailed description of the machinery and process of factory machine made matzah.

Lesser was one of the founders of the Agudath ha-Rabbonim in 1903, and became its first president. For many years, he served with great distinction on its executive. Attracted to the ideals of religious Zionism, he supported the efforts of Mizrachi and openly disagreed with those rabbinic colleagues who opposed Zionism. Lesser died in Cincinnati on the night of Yom Kippur, 1924.
