Sof Davar

Rabbi Shaul Silber (1881-1946)

In the last entry of Sof Davar, I wrote of Rabbi Nissan Yablonski, who became, in 1922, the first rosh yeshiva of the newly formed Hebrew Theological College- Beis HaMidrash LeTorah. Yablonsky's untimely death in 1928, at the young age of 51, limited his influence on the institution. Far more significant was the longstanding impact of Rabbi Shaul Silber, who served for many years as a local Chicago rav, and President of Hebrew Theological College.

Shaul Silber was born in a small village near Kovno, Lithuania, but at age ten, moved with his parents to Dvinsk, Latvia. After six years of yeshiva study in Dvinsk, Silber left for Lida to study under the guidance of Rabbi Yitzchak Yaakov Reines. Rav Reines' yeshiva was distinct in that it encouraged students to study Tanach and included a measure of secular studies in its curriculum. Rav Reines was also a leading supporter of religious Zionism and would come to have considerable influence on the direction of the Mizrachi movement of religious Zionism. There is no doubt that this had a lasting influence on the young, Shaul Silber, and would shape the direction of Beis HaMidrash LeTorah-Hebrew Theological College.

In 1900, Silber moved to the United States, married three years later, accepted pulpits in Columbus and Youngstown, Ohio, before becoming rabbi, in 1910, at one of Chicago's most prestigious synagogues, Cong. Anshe Shalom. For the next 35 years, Silber would come to have a major impact on Orthodox Jewish life in general and Chicago Orthodoxy in particular.

Though trained in the yeshivas of Eastern Europe, Silber was different from most of his Eastern European colleagues. Fluent in English, well versed in American history, literature and culture, Silber was among the first of a small but growing cadre of rabbis who wanted secular studies to be included in yeshiva education, and who worked with non-Orthodox rabbis, when communal matters called for unified action. A passionate advocate of religious Zionism, he served for many years as vice-president of American Mizrachi, and attended several World Zionist Congresses in Europe. In 1926, he emigrated to Palestine with the hope of establishing a business in the sale of oranges. Unable to support his family, he returned to Chicago a year later.

As President of Beis HaMidrash LeTorah-Hebrew Theological College, Silber used his diplomatic skills, success in fund-raising, widespread personal connections and administrative talent to guide the Chicago yeshiva through difficult financial times, and to fashion it into the pre-eminent yeshiva of Chicago, a reputation it retained for many years.
