Sof Davar

R. Chaim Isaac Korb (1872-1957)

In a previous item of Sof Davar, I discussed the founding of Chicago's Beis HaMidrash la-Torah, Hebrew Theological College, in 1921, and presented the story of its first rosh yeshiva, Rabbi Nissan Yablonski. Following the untimely death of Rav Yablonski in 1928, at the young age of 51, the yeshiva turned to R. Chaim Isaac Korb to serve as rosh yeshiva.

Born in Latvia in 1872, the young Chaim Korb came to the attention and was acquainted with Latvia's two acclaimed talmidei chachomim, Rabbi Meir Simcha of Dvinsk, author of the Ohr Sameach, and Rav Yosef Rozin, known throughout Europe as the Rogotchover Gaon. Korb left Latvia to study at the Telshe Yeshiva, where he spent several years, receiving semicha from the great Telshe rosh yeshiva, Rabbi Eliezer Gordon. After marrying Leah Miriam, daughter of Rabbi Moshe Yitzchak of Ponevez, he continued his Talmud studies in Ponevez. Following the death of his father-in-law, he accepted a position as *rav moreh tzedek*, not communal rabbi in Ponevez.

While at Ponevez, R. Korb became close to the eminent Talmud scholar, Rabbi Itzel of Ponevez, with whom he would maintain an ongoing correspondence in matters of halacha. Following six years of service as rabbi in Ponevez, R. Korb accepted the position of communal rabbi in Polangen, near Kovno, Lithuania. With the outbreak of World War I, in 1914, he fled south to the Ukraine, and following the war, returned to Lithuania, accepting a position as communal rabbi of Zagar.

In 1927, Rabbi Chaim Korb left Europe and emigrated to the United States, where he became rabbi of a shul in Harlem, New York. That same year, he published his first work of Talmud commentary, *Netivot Olam*, dealing with difficult passages in the Rambam's *Mishneh Torah*. He would subsequently publish two additional volumes of commentary under the same title. Remaining in New York for only a short period, Rabbi Korb, in 1928, accepted the position as rosh yeshiva at Beis HaMidrash la-Torah, in Chicago. For almost twenty years, he served with distinction as leader of Chicago's Hebrew Theological College.

Tragically, two of Rabbi Korb's children, who had remained in Europe, were killed by the Nazis during World War II. Following the death of his wife in the late 1940s, he moved to Jerusalem, where he spent his final years. It was in Jerusalem that he completed the third volume of his multi-volume work, *Netivot Olam.* R. Chaim Isaac Korb died in 1957, and is buried at Har ha-Menuchot.
