Rabbi Chaim Heller (1879-1960)

Throughout his life, Rabbi Chaim Heller attempted to avoid attention. He became a rosh kollel, a rosh yeshiva, sought after for speaking engagements, and considered for the position of succeeding Rav Avraham I. Kook during the 1930s. The Rav, R. Yoseph Dov Soloveitchik z"tl regarded him as a Torah genius, with a breadth of scholarship in both Torah and secular subjects. His preference for anonymity has largely been fulfilled. Today his name is hardly known.

Born in Bialystok, Poland, in 1879, Chaim Heller was almost entirely self-taught. He had little formal elementary schooling, nor did he attend any of the famous yeshivas of Europe. Instead, he studied privately with the occasional help of tutors who answered his questions and monitored the progress of his work. In time, the young boy was regarded as a illuyi by many great rabbonim of Eastern Europe. Following years of privately studying gemara and halacha, R. Heller was eager to broaden his knowledge. He traveled to Germany, where he completed a doctorate at the University of Wurzburg.

After concluding his work in Germany, R. Chaim Heller moved to Warsaw, Poland before accepting, what became, a short-lived position as rav/av beit din of Lomza, Poland in 1912. The tumult and danger of World War I precipitated his move to Homel, Belorus, and in 1917, he returned to Germany. Five years later in 1922, R. Chaim Heller established the Beit Hamidrash Ha-Elyon, a yeshiva-kollel in Berlin. As founder and Rosh Kollel, he accepted only outstanding students of Talmud into the kollel program. Unlike most yeshivas of the time, Rav Heller did not object to the yeshiva students supplementing their Talmud study with formal university education. Though not a formal student at the kollel, Rav Yoseph D. Soloveitchik davened and learned Torah at R. Chaim Heller's Beit Hamidrash Elyon, during his years at the U. of Berlin.

In 1937, with the rise of Nazism, R. Heller fled Germany for the United States, where he joined the faculty of the Rabbi Isaac Elchanan Theological Seminary (RIETS) in New York. Preferring a private life of study and research, Rav Heller served at the yeshiva not as a regular rosh yeshiva, but as a casual maggid shiur. He also gave occasional classes and lectures at the Bernard Revel Graduate School of Yeshiva University, though he never served as a full-time professor.

R. Heller's vast erudition combining traditional knowledge of Talmud and codes with expertise in modern methods of research resulted in the publication of several important works of halacha and commentary. In matters of Jewish law, R. Heller's two-volume I'Chikrei Halakha, on Choshen Mishpat, and his critical edition of the Rambam's, Sefer ha-Mitzvot, based on the original Arabic, two translations and several early printed editions, was widely hailed by roshei yeshiva and academic scholars alike, as an important contribution to the study of Maimonides. Rabbi Israel Meir HaCohen, (the Chofetz Chaim) is reported to have relied exclusively on R. Heller's edition of the Sefer ha-Mitzvot. In addition to his work on Maimonides and halakhic material, R. Heller published several works of biblical scholarship, including an annotated edition of the Peshitta on Bereshit and Shemot, and several important essays on the Yerushalmi Targum. R. Heller's work has been regarded as sufficiently significant, that for the past 40 years, a modest collection of supercommentary has emerged based on his published editions and

R. Chaim Heller died in New York on April 10, 1960. The Rav travelled from Boston to attend the funeral, and later published a hesped in memory of R. Chaim Heller.
