R. Shlomo Heiman (1892-1944)

The Ramailes yeshiva was a well known Vilna institution founded in 1831, in a small courtyard, which had once been known in Yiddish as "Reb Mayle's heyf," (*Reb Mayle's courtyard*). Yiddish phonetics worked its charm, as decades later, Reb Mayle long forgotten, the yeshiva acquired fame as the Ramailes yeshiva. Several distinguished roshai yeshiva, including R. Abele Posveler and R. Israel Salanter were associated with the yeshiva during the late 1800s. The Ramailes yeshiva was not a Yeshiva Gedola like Slobodka, Mir or Telz, but one of several 'feeder' yeshivas, where young outstanding prospects attended, usually around age 12 or 13. By age 16-17, these young *iluyim* would transfer to the more well known yeshivas of Europe.

R. Shlomo Heiman and R. Yisroel Zev Gustman were two outstanding talmidei chachamim, students of the great gedolim of Eastern Europe, who found their way to America. They were both associated with the Ramailes Yeshiva in Vilna. Born in 1892, in the small town of Paritsh, near Minsk, Belarus, Shlomo Heiman was 12 years old, when he went to Halusk,(more widely known as Kaminetz yeshiva, which was then located in Halusk) to study under Rav Baruch Ber Leibowitz. For the rest of his life, he regarded R. Baruch Ber as his primary rebbe. When war began in 1914, R. Heiman was drafted and served for a while in the Russian army. Upon his safe return, he was asked to become a maggid shiur at Yeshiva Ohel Torah of Baranowitz, headed by Rav Elchonon Wasserman.

Following marriage, his great mentor R. Boruch Ber appointed him maggid shiur in his yeshiva, Knesset Beis Yitzchok-Kaminetz. From that time on, he would gain renown as one of the great *gedolim* of the Lithuanian yeshiva world. As his reputation grew, R. Chaim Ozer Grodzinski of Vilna, asked R. Shlomo Heiman to come to Vilna to lead the Ramailes yeshiva, where he would come to serve as rosh yeshiva for eight years, from 1927-35.

During the 1930's, R. Shraga Feivel Mendlovitz was eager to bring a great talmid chacham from Eastern Europe to the Torah Vodaath Yeshiva. In 1935, with the approval of Reb Chaim Ozer, R. Shlomo Heiman agreed to come to Brooklyn, N.Y. to become rosh yeshiva at Mesivta Torah Vodaath. In accepting this position, he was spared the horrors of the Holocaust. Some of his notable talmidim included R. Eliyahu Moshe Shisgal (son in law of R. Moshe Feinstein), Rav Shmuel Brudny of Mir, and the Bostoner Rebbe.

Sadly, R. Shlomo Heiman died in 1944, at the relatively young age of 52. Two decades following his death, a two-volume collection of his *chiddushim* was published as *Chiddushei Rabbi Shlomo*, based on his writings and the notes of students. The work is still widely used in many yeshivos today.
