RABBI'S CORNER

We begin reciting "V'sein Tal U'Matar L'vracha" in the beracha of *Barech Aleinu* at Maariv this coming Wednesday night (December 4). If one mistakenly says "V'sein Beracha" and forgets to recite "V'sein Tal U'Matar L'vracha," they must repeat the *Shemoneh Esrei*. The appropriate action depends on when the mistake is realized:

-If one remembers during the beracha of Barech Aleinu:

They should say "V'sein Tal U'Matar L'vracha" at the point where they realized the omission and then continue from there to complete the beracha.

REMINDER: Emergency Defibrillators are located on the upstairs wall hallway & the entry hallway downstairs.

-If one remembers after completing Barech Aleinu:

If they realize before starting the beracha of *Shema Koleinu* (or after saying "Baruch Atah Hashem" of *m'vareich hashanim*), they should insert "V'sein Tal U'Matar L'vracha" in the beracha of *Shema Koleinu*. Specifically, this should be done after the words "reikam al tashiveinu" and continue with "ki Atah shomeia" and complete the beracha as usual.

-If one remembers after completing Shema Koleinu:

They must return to the beracha of *Barech Aleinu* and recite "V'sein Tal U'Matar L'vracha" there, then continue the *Shemoneh Esrei* from that poin.

If one only realizes after finishing Shemoneh Esrei (after "Yihiyu L'ratzon"):

They must return to the beginning and repeat the entire *Shemoneh Esrei*.
