RABBI'S CORNER

There are halachos regarding eating fish and meat at the same meal (See Shulchan Aruch Yoreh Deah 116:2-3) which are often relevant to many individuals at our shul's kiddush:

- If someone eats fish and then wants to eat meat, or vice versa, they must eat or drink something in between. A cracker or any other pareve item suffices, and any beverage is acceptable.
- Fish and meat should not be placed on the same plate, and separate plates should be used for each.
- Ideally, a different fork should be used for fish and meat unless it is thoroughly wiped clean in between.
